Where will we plant 10 million trees?



ALONG STREAMS

Streamside buffers—forested areas next to streams, lakes, and wetlands on farms and other areas—help filter polluted runoff, provide habitat, and stabilize stream banks.



IN CITIES AND TOWNS

Urban and suburban tree plantings occur on developed land where trees help filter polluted runoff, provide shade, and increase property values.



ON ABANDONED MINE LANDS

Landscapes adversely impacted by pre-1980 coal-mining operations need intervention to loosen compacted soil, correct chemical or nutrient deficiencies, and replace current vegetation.

We have prioritized target areas to plant:

- 6 million trees along streams, particularly agricultural land and concentrated water flow landscapes
- 3 million trees in high-density urban and suburban, including along streets
- 1 million trees on abandoned and legacy mine lands
